## Library Director's Report October 2023

Halloween programming was a huge success, with over a thousand visits to our first-ever indoor Haunted House. Preschoolers, early elementary school children, parents, and grandparents were amazed at the high quality, immersive decorations and family-friendly design. Kids walked through a safe-to-touch glowing maze packed with motion-sensor characters, a pumpkin patch for perfect photos, a funny graveyard, and a mad scientist lab for older siblings. 125 people attended our Monster Mash Family Dance parties, while adults enjoyed Horror trivia and a Ghost Garland craft night, continuing the trend that Halloween is not just for kids!

Important planning has begun with School District 68 on efforts to make getting a Woodridge Public Library card an "opt-in" feature of registering for school, and on possible school-day field trips to the Library for special events. The Park District partnership continues with a good turnout for the October Stories in the Park, held at the Library due to weather. The Park District has asked us to share the results from our Teen Focus Group, in which over 40 teens participated by completing a survey after touring the Teen Area and talking with staff.
