Library Director's Report October 2024

The percentage of residents with Library Cards jumped 2.4% to 69.4%. We processed 843 new cards, due in part to our student card requests from the Woodridge District 68 and Downers Grove District 58 outreach effort. More cards for students are still being processed.

Over 1700 people walked through the Not-So-Scary Haunted House, heaping praise on the staff and the experience—this effort involved every Children's staff member with support from all other Library departments. Many October programs—for children and adults—were filled to capacity.

The Village of Woodridge invited the Library to help host a Town Centre "Winterfest" on Saturday, November 23. The Library building will stay open until 9:30 p.m. as a warming center and event location hosting live music, a children's craft, and a meet and greet with popular Disney characters. A few Library staffers will oversee our participation supported by Village and Library volunteers. Most of the expenses, including tree lighting, paid characters, portion of live music, promotion, and safety measures will be sponsored by the Village.
