Library Director's Report April 2024

The Library's April 8 pop-up viewing of the eclipse was a hit. 1200 eclipse glasses were given away in the first days of April/200 pairs were held in reserve. On the big day, Circ. Staff handled three hours of constant phone calls about free glasses, inviting callers to join us at the library. Over 300 people visited during the eclipse, sharing glasses, kid viewers, science facts, and sky-watching stories, plus NASA's live-stream and children's science activities. Images of library patrons watching the eclipse reached 3800 people; re-shared by the Village, our Facebook post brought us local fame and a great comment: "Thank you so much for this event. I stopped by last minute and was able to see the eclipse thanks to you! Everyone was good about sharing glasses. I always tell people my library is the best library!"

Art was a popular draw last month with preschoolers attending the Artastic program and Downers Grove North Fine Art teachers assembling an eye-catching exhibit featuring teen artworks (jewelry, 3D metallic masks, painting, and photography). Barbie stole the show with a fantastic day of play and imagination and many, many visitors in hot pink and sunglasses on April 20. The staff in-service focused on preparing for an increase in summer programs and visitors, along with an informative retirement speaker, with individual IMRF advice sessions available to staff.
