Library Director's Report May 2024

"Cicada Art Swarms Woodridge Public Library," read a recent headline in the Woodridge Patch, summing up the busy and exciting month of May for patrons, volunteers, and staff. An informative virtual event on cicadas was attended live online by 71 Woodridge patrons and 200 people entered the cicada-coloring contest. Children's staff met with over 2300 students during their Summer Reading Tour of local schools, resulting in excellent pre-registration numbers (1,500 children are currently enrolled), and the Mother's Day Tea Party has become a beloved annual tradition.

The Library was the site of a six-week course helping vulnerable people avoid diabetes, part of our collaboration with the South Suburban Immigration Project non-profit and the DuPage Health Coalition. We assisted the Woodridge Rotary in printing certificates for an annual essay contest for local youth, and our May 1 Volunteer Lunch marked the first time since the pandemic that adult volunteers have gathered with the Staff that supervise their activities. We have received notice that our 2024 State of Illinois Per Capita grant for \$50,724.63 has been granted—an amount \$341.58 greater than we've received in recent years due to an increase in funding of 1 cent per person.

Library Operations
