## Library Director's Report September 2024

Storytime programs made for a very busy September. We responded to a high demand for more preschool programs for children ages three to five by adding a new preschool session. Overall, Children's program attendance was up 13.8% over last September with preschool attendance up 90%. In response to patron requests, we added an evening story program. Family Storytime was well-attended (48) in September and will be offered each month. Teen and Adult program attendance was strong, with attendance up 40% over last September. We increased the number of fall programs and "seats" that are open for registration to meet the demand. Some of this success comes from our craft programs that take place in our Creativity Space on the Plaza.

Young adult students from Guiding Light Academy began volunteering for us on a regular basis. Our goal is to provide opportunities to the students and their supervising teachers that are similar to experiences in a work environment. We are adopting Beanstack as our new software program for hosting patron-reading programs; it will allow us to offer a greater variety of reading-based events (summer reading, winter reading, competitions, and community challenges). Patrons will find the programs attractive and easy to use for signing up or tracking their reading online or in an app.
